



**REMINDER TO ALL THAT ARE ON PRE-AUTHORIZED WITHDRAWALS
FOR THE PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS:**

The last payment will be withdrawn in September. This payment amount will be HIGHER than the amount of all your other withdrawals, as it reflects the amount left owing on your account since Quinte West set the 2026 tax rates at an increase of 4.99%.

LARGE & BULK GOODS FALL CLEAN UP:

The Fall Bulk Pick-up will begin on **Tuesday Oct 6, 2026** and conclude on **Wednesday Oct 7**. Please place items at the curb by no later than **9 pm** on **Monday Oct 5**. Remember that the pick-up is for residents only! Residents found putting items out that are not theirs will have their privilege revoked and items will not be picked up at this time or in the future.

If it can fit in a garbage bag (vacuum, small appliance, garden hose) it must be disposed of during regular weekly pick-up (with bag tag applied) and will not be picked up by the staff. Staff will pick up chairs, end tables, TV stands, small bundled wood (3' X 3'), carpet, couches, desks, mattresses, box springs, toilets, stoves, dishwashers, washers, dryers, microwaves, humidifiers, and barbecues. Tires, wooden or plastic pallets, hazardous waste, fridges, freezers, air-conditioners, water coolers,

dehumidifiers, propane tanks, construction materials or recycling will not be picked up.

City of Quinte West also offers bulk item pick-up year-round. Purchase a ticket online or at City Hall, place ticket on item and put at curb on the specified Friday morning before 8 a.m. The Quinte West crew will pick it up on that day.

A BIG "**Thank You**" to all the **RESPONSIBLE PET OWERS** in Kenron! Whether you're a dog and/or cat owner.....

Thank you for:

- Using the proper 6 ft length leash on your pet(s) so that your pet is safe on our streets and that I don't have to zig-zag around your pet(s) to get around them while I am driving.
- Keeping your cat secure by leashing it in your yard or having a fenced yard so your pet cannot go wondering around the neighbourhood
- Being respectful by not allowing your pet(s) on my yard or your neighbour's yard to use as (your pets') toilet
- Being responsible by picking up after your pet(s) and putting the used bag in the proper garbage bin by the mailboxes or taking the bag home to put in your own garbage bin
- Recognising that having a small dog(s) or cat still requires picking up after your pet
- Not allowing your dog(s) to urinate on the new trees in the green spaces.

- Having a well-behaved dog(s) that don't bark throughout the night and/or early mornings
 - Knowing and following Kenron's (and Quinte West) bylaws regarding your responsibilities as a good pet owner.

SELLING YOUR HOUSE

Please make sure that you notify the Board of Directors that you will be listing your home for Sale **prior** to listing. The Park Standards Committee will schedule a site visit to verify that all Park Standards are being met, if they are not, an Undertaking will be created and given to the listing agent for the purchasers to complete within a calendar year from the closing date.

TREES AND SHRUBS

Homeowners are responsible for trimming trees and shrubs back so they do not block the view of any signs, lights or impede the view of the roadway, as well as to trim all trees so no limbs are less than a height of **14** ft, in order not to damage any large vehicles using the roads. Please remember to trim any branches that are overhanging on your neighbour's property. Thank you to all the home owners who have trimmed or removed their trees.

Garbage

- If you are putting your garbage out the night before pick up day, please ensure it is safe from wildlife. Many Neighbours are having to clean up garbage that is not theirs before the Trucks come around.

COMPOST

Compost pick-up will end Dec 1 or the first snowfall, whichever comes first.

WINTER REMINDERS

There is no street parking at any time, but especially in the winter months to ensure that the plows can get through when needed. Offending vehicles may be subject to being towed.

Don't forget to plug in your heat tape when the cold weather begins.
