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Free Meal Programs in Quinte West

Quinte West Hot Meal Pick-Up (Belleville and Quinte West Community Health Centre): Offers free, healthy, hot take-away meals on the 2nd and 4th Friday of each month from 2:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. No registration is required, and everyone is welcome. Location: 69 Catherine St., Trenton.

New Beginnings Support Centre: Provides a free lunch program from Monday to Friday at Noon (sign-up by 11:30 a.m.). Location: 76 Dundas Street West, Trenton.

Kathryn's Kitchen & St. James Anglican Church: Hosts a free lunch program on Monday to Fridays from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Fridays also feature an additional take-away lunch option. Location: 15 South Street, Trenton.

Trenton United Church: Offers a free hot lunch program on the 1st and 3rd Friday of each month from 11:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Special diets can be accommodated. It is recommended to call ahead to confirm times. Location: 85 Station Street, Trenton.

Community Partners For Success (CPFS): This organization provides a soup kitchen, food hampers, and free clothing, along with other social services. Location: 50 Elgin St, Trenton.

Food Banks

Food banks provide groceries and essentials for individuals and families to prepare meals at home. Generally, clients must bring proof of local residency and potentially income/expenses on their first visit.

Trenton Care & Share Food Bank: Clients can access food once a month through their "Share Market," which includes fresh produce, meat, dairy, and non-perishable goods. Location: 30 Pelham St, Unit 2, Trenton.

Hours (for clients): Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday: 10:00 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. (The third Thursday of each month is also open from 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m.).
