Sewer System Please remember that wipes, rags and incontinence products cannot be flushed down the toilet, they must be placed in the garbage as they clog sewer lines and our sewer pumps. Failure to do so, has cost everyone in Kenron this year, as money had to be spent to unclog the sewer pumps instead of the other projects that Residents wanted to be completed.

TREES AND SHRUBS

Homeowners are responsible for trimming shrubs back so they do not block the view of any signs or impede the view on the roadway, as well as to trim all trees so no limbs are less than a height of 13.6 ft, in order not to damage any large vehicles using the roads.

COMMUNITY YARD SALE

Our Annual Community Yard Sale will be held Saturday September 11th and Sunday September 12^{th.} The Board asks that you comply with health and safety measures mandated by H.P.E Public Health to keep our community safe. There will be 4 porta-potties placed strategically around the park for visitors to use.

LARGE & BULKY GOODS/FALL CLEAN UP:

This pick up is designed for residents who have large items which cannot be disposed of through regular garbage pick-up i.e.: an old chair etc. The Bulk Pick-up week has been set for the week of **September 13-16th, 2021**. If it can fit in a garbage bag (vacuum, small appliance, garden hose) it must be disposed of during regular weekly pick-up (with bag tag applied) and will not be picked up by the staff. **No tires, hazardous waste, propane tanks, or recycling will be picked up.** The pick-up is for residents only! Residents found putting items out that are not theirs will have their privilege revoked and items will not be picked up.

Quinte West also offers bulky item pick-up. Purchase a ticket online or at City Hall, place ticket on item and put at curb on Friday morning before 8 a.m. The Quinte West crew will pick it up. Prices are listed below.

Small Items - Kitchen chair, end table, TV stand, small bundled wood (3' X 3'), Carpet - \$10 each Large Items - Couch, chair, desk, mattress, box spring, toilets, tanks - \$15 each

Non-Freon Items - Stove, dishwasher, washer, dryer, microwave, humidifier, barbecue - \$27.30 Freon Items - Fridge, Freezer, air-conditioner, water cooler, dehumidifier - \$37.80

Security Devices

You are permitted to install cameras on your site; however, they can only capture images in your yard (front, back or side) not your neighbours' property as that is an infringement on your neighbours' rights. You must have a sign posted that states that the home is under surveillance.

Outdoor Work

Any and all work performed outside of your home (exterior of home, decks, sheds, trees, gardens, lawn etc.), must have an alteration request completed and submitted to the Board of Directors and approval given before starting the work. Alteration request forms can be picked up at the office or printed from the Kenron Website (www.kenronestates.com).

Quinte Transit

Effective Aug 9, 2021, Quinte Transit is now offering On-Demand pickup service in Kenron Estates, Monday to Friday. You must call 613-392-9640 or 1-855-2839640 to book ahead. This route will stop at the Trenton Town Centre, Loyalist College and an early Morning stop (5:50 am) at the Belleville Terminal. This service fee is exact cash only or they do have monthly passes that can be purchased. Seniors and students are \$5 each way. Regular fare is \$6 each way.

COMPOST PICK UP:

Weekly compost pickup resumed Monday, April 12th, 2021 and will continue every Monday until the SNOW covers the ground. If a statutory holiday falls on a Monday, compost will be picked up the following day. Composting materials are grass, leaves, plant matter, and yard waste, but should NOT include dog waste! We will accept your compostable items in biodegradable paper bags only. Compost

must be out to the curb by **8:00** am. <u>Brush or small tree limbs up to 2.5" in diameter must be cut in 4'</u> <u>lengths and tied in bundles</u>. Loose brush piles will not be picked up. If you remove a tree, you must dispose of the tree/brush off site. It cannot be disposed of in the compound area.

ANIMAL OWNERS:

This year we have had numerous complaints about <u>cats</u> roaming the neighborhood, so please remember to put them on a leash or chain if they are outside. Animal Control can trap any loose cats or dogs and take them to the Humane Society.

A reminder to all pet owners of the by-law which was amended at the KRA Annual Meeting held October 27, 2016, which reads "All pets must be leashed when off the home site at all times and <u>are only</u> <u>permitted on the roads and common areas so as not to interfere with the rights or enjoyment of other</u> <u>residents of their Mobile Home Sites</u>. This means that the leash is not extended so that your dog can walk on neighbours' lawns.

Also, we have noticed a considerable increase in dog waste that has not been picked up on the edges of people's lawns and driveways. We have had to speak to several residents regarding this issue, so please ensure you clean up after your dog.

Heat Tape Checks: Just a reminder to all residents to check your heat tapes to ensure that they are plugged in, working properly and have not been damaged by rodents as winter is quickly approaching. Also, don't forget to shut off your outside tap and drain the water to ensure that it doesn't freeze in the winter.
